Castlerigg Manor 50th Anniversary

This year Castlerigg Manor celebrates its 50th Anniversary as the home of Lancaster Diocesan Youth Service. On 7th July 2019, Bishop Paul will attend a celebration barbeque at the Manor. He looks forward to seeing many of you there. The work of the Youth Service is broader than the Castlerigg experience; it has to be, since much of the work of Castlerigg is dedicated to groups of young people from outside the Diocese. Their work within the Diocese involves schools, youth faith groups, liaising with chaplains, organising the youth involvement in the Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes. More recently, there has been engagement with the World Youth Days as well as the Rome Synod on Youth. The Youth Service must be flexible; ready to change and grow in response to the demands of the times but never compromising the call to serve the Gospel of Christ. Our 7th July celebrations allow us to thank God for the past and ask His blessings on the future.
